PROGRAMME OF STUDY FOR BUSINESS

Purpose of Study from the National Curriculum

This specification is designed to encourage candidates to consider the practical application of business and economic concepts. The units provide students with the opportunity to explore the theories and concepts in the context of events in the business and economic world.

Aims from the National Curriculum

GCSE Business subjects and Economics will encourage students to:

- engage in the study of business and economics to develop as effective and independent learners
- use a critical approach to distinguish between fact and opinion, build arguments and make informed judgments
- develop and apply knowledge, understanding and skills to contemporary issues in local, national and global contexts
- appreciate the range of perspectives of different stakeholders in relation to business and economic activities
- consider the extent to which business and economic activity can be ethical and sustainable
- recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of concepts, issues and terminology
- apply skills, knowledge and understanding in a variety of contexts and in planning and carrying out investigations and tasks
- analyse and evaluate evidence, make reasoned judgments and present appropriate conclusions.

Studying Business at Brannel School

Business is an important part of the Brannel School GCSE offering. Within the area self-employment stands at 26%, which is one of the highest in the country. This is why understanding business modelling, forecasting and marketing is a lifelong skill for our students. It teaches the students areas of business that will be useful whether they run their own business or manage people for a large scale business.

Curriculum Provision for Business at Brannel School

Students at Brannel School study Business during Key Stage 4. They receive the following number of 75 minutes sessions per fortnight during each cycle of the two week timetable.
