

## Exam Tips

The exam will test you on all 4 topics that you have studied:

Understand how to support individuals to maintain their rights.

Understand the importance of the values of care and how they are applied.

Understand how legislation impacts on care settings.

Understand how personal hygiene, safety and security measures protect individuals.

### Command Verbs

Command Verbs	Meaning
Identify	Give brief information or facts such as naming, stating or listing who or what something is. These are often one-word answers.
Outline	Give the main key aspects or facts about something.
Describe	Give an account that includes all of the relevant facts, features, qualities or aspects of something.
Explain	Provide more depth and detail than a description. You will include relevant reasons for, purpose of, or effects of something.
Analyse	Separate information into components and examine it methodically and in detail, in order to explain and interpret it.
Discuss	Give an account that considers a range of ideas and viewpoints.
Assess	Give a reasoned judgement or opinion of the quality, standard or effectiveness of something, informed by relevant facts.
Evaluate	Make a judgement about something by taking into account different factors and including strengths and weaknesses/ positives and negatives.

### Exam Technique

- Read each question twice before you start answering.
- Underline or highlight the command verb, so that you are clear what you are being asked to do.
- If a question asks for 'ways' or 'methods' or 'reasons' without stating a number of 'ways' or 'methods' or 'reasons', you must give a **minimum** of two because it is a plural.
- For higher mark questions (worth 5 – 8 marks) write your answer in paragraphs. Each paragraph should focus on a specific aspect. This ensures your answer is organised and logical.
- Make sure your answer is relevant to the question. Don't just write everything you know about a topic.
- Learn key terms for each topic.
- Use correct terminology in your answers.
- If you have to continue an answer on extra paper, make sure you put the question number and section e.g. 3a or 5c.
- Do not leave any questions unanswered. Always have a go, you probably know more than you think you do!
