Our £17m school building opened in 2011. It is one of only a handful of schools in Cornwall to be completely redesigned and rebuilt as part of the *Building Schools for the Future* agenda. Our aim is to use our inspirational building and modern teaching and learning facilities to provide a 21st century, world class education for our students.

At Brannel we understand that education is about so much more than an excellent set of exam results, as important as these are. Brannel is a place characterised by constructive, open and trusting relationships. Relationships amongst pupils within and across year groups are warm and friendly. Our talented and dedicated teachers know each student as an individual and accompany them on each leg of their journey.

Investigate

Investigate: to examine, study, or inquire into systematically Brannel's Science, Mathematics and ICT departments are housed in our Investigate Wing

Science is about asking 'what would happen if...?' It sparks curiosity and encourages young people to consider the world around us and how it works. Science is also much more than a body of knowledge. It is a way of thinking. We understand that higher student achievement requires excellent teachers who are trained in teaching strategies that promote active, inquiry-based learning. An understanding of curriculum content is not enough; our teachers encourage students to be curious, to trust reason, logic and their common sense.

We all use Maths - in the supermarket, designing a DIY project, planning a holiday. However, Mathematics involves more than computation and arithmetic. It is a science and an art; a study of pattern and structure, characterised by order and internal consistency. Mathematics can be used to model and solve problems arising from the physical world - an abstract mathematical problem, for example, laid the foundations for the advent of the modern computer. We aim to enrich our students' experience of Mathematics and stretch the most able through depth rather than by accelerating them.

Our ICT department is focused on digital literacy, which is the

ability to locate, organise, evaluate, and analyse information using digital technology. Our students gain a knowledge of current high-technology, and an understanding of how it can be used to support research and investigative skills.











Express

Express: to convey a thought or feeling in words or by gestures and conduct
Brannel's English, Drama and Music departments are housed in our Express Wing

The teaching of English is at the very heart of what we do. Through its study we encourage students to communicate effectively and with curiosity, and to enjoy reading. We study English because it is fascinating, fun and important. Learning how to read, write and speak is essential to every child's personal growth; it ensures that the leaner can access the wider curriculum and benefit from the opportunities in school and it enables the individual to take a meaningful place in society.

Studying Drama requires emotional maturity, and gives students a deep understanding of themselves. Because it involves using not only their voices and bodies, but also emotions and creativity, it is able to engender a deep sense of self-esteem. It is also a subject that requires a great deal of peer trust, and so it plays an important role in teaching communication, listening and empathy skills.

Music is proven to have a significant impact on learning and socialisation. Studies show clear links between sustained involvement in music and theatre, and academic success. Successfully learning to play a musical instrument boosts self-confidence and provides a new outlet for expression. Music helps young people explore emotions, which in turn helps them better understand who they are.

Create

Create: to cause something to come into being; to evolve from thought or imagination Brannel's Art, Design and Technology departments are housed in our Create Wing

Our students explore a range of creative disciplines such as Product Design, Electronics, Food Technology, Art, Graphics, Creative Textiles, Ceramics, Sculpture and Photography. Students are encouraged to develop confidence, competence, imagination and creativity; to reflect critically on their own and other people's work, judging quality, value and meaning. They learn to think and act as artists, craftspeople and designers.

Through exploration of techniques and processes, students are encouraged to work independently to seek and discover personal interpretation and artistic preference.

Our aim is to ensure that students are not only literate in words and numbers when they leave school, but also literate in the complex language of visual communication.

We believe that Art, Design and Technology helps our students to become problem solvers through practical tasks, using creativity and imagination. It is an area which enables students to make sense of appliances and processes in their environment, primarily through first-hand experience and exploration. It extends their curiosity as to how and why things work by providing opportunities to apply and develop skills of planning, designing and making.

Discover

Discover: to gain sight or knowledge of something previously unseen or unknown Brannel's Humanities and Languages departments are housed in our Discover Wing

In our Discover Wing, students are exposed to the historical, philosophical, cultural and technical through a study of History, Geography, Religious and Philosophical Studies, Media Studies, French and Spanish. Our Curriculum Enhancement programme offers Citizenship, Personal, Social, Healthand Economic education.

Why do we believe that a study of the Humanities is essential? We live in a world increasingly dominated by Science; Science offers us facts, answers, truth and certainty. However, it is precisely because Science is so powerful that we need the Humanities. The Humanities present us with uncertainty,

doubt and scepticism; they are less about answers and more about questions. What is truth? How do we know something is true? Or rather, why do we believe certain things are true and other things are not? How do we decide whether something is wrong or right to do, for us personally or for society as a whole?

If Science in the 21st century has replaced religion as our main source of answers to these questions; the Humanities keep us from being trapped by our own desire for certainty. Our students are encouraged to question the nature of reality: about what we are; about the purpose of life; about what we can be and should be.

Imagine

Imagine: to form a picture or idea in your mind of something that is not real or present Brannel's Imagine Wing is a nurturing environment for our students who have special needs

Our Imagine Wing is a purpose-built, well-resourced and colourful space. It houses our mainstream Learning Support classroom for children who have Special Educational Needs, and our Area Resource Base (ARB) which caters for up to 12 students with complex and multiple learning needs or disabilities.

The ARB is fully wheelchair accessible and comprises two large teaching classroom spaces, a life skills kitchen and eating area, a therapy room and a sensory room. The classrooms open onto an enclosed outside play area with a sensory garden and raised planting beds for gardening.

Our ARB curriculum is designed to stimulate a love for learning and a passion for 'finding out'. We offer a broad and balanced curriculum that is tailored to meet the needs of individual students. Mainstream curriculum opportunities are offered for those who are able to access particular academic areas or who are ready to experience mainstream environments. All our students are encouraged to join in the social life of the school. Within the ARB we encourage our students to be as independent as possible whilst providing a safe, secure environment where each young person can feel confident to explore and develop their learning – and have fun!
