It's important that we give students the opportunity to see what a university looks like and to learn about the subjects that are available to study in Cornwall.








Geography

Year 7 created contour models in Geography after learning about maps. Head of Geography, Mrs White, said "I was really impressed with the level of detail and creativity this year."










